Earlier this year, we acted in the case of *Braet v Ramputh* as counsel for one of the Defendants.¹ Our client sought to defend the action, as well as to commence a Crossclaim against another Defendant. However, the Defendant against whom we sought to commence a Crossclaim had not delivered a Notice of Intent to Defend, or a Statement of Defence, bringing the Defendant within Rule 28.04(2) of the *Rules of Civil Procedure*. Under this Rule, the Defendant shall be served with the Statement of Defence and Crossclaim *personally, or by an alternative to personal service*.
